This project will work with Cal Fire to ensure our area meets their guidelines and make updates where we don't. ☐ Community Partnerships- We're building partnerships with other Fire Safe/Wise councils in the area as well as other community organizations such as local road associations, NCO, etc ☐ Fire Preparedness Library - We're building an online library of fire preparedness training materials ☐ Bulk purchasing/discounts - Put together a list of recommended go-bag, home hardening and fire fighting gear. Work with local hardware stores to get the materials stocked, employees trained, and get a discount for fire safe/wise council members. ☐ Website - the council needs to build a website to host things such as educational materials and escape routes maps, provide updates to members, and manage REN and the council membership. ■ Road and Trail Maintenance - on-going project to monitor road and fire trail conditions. Hold work days or contract out to address safety issues such as fire fuel reduction, visibility issues, and marking dangerous sections and hazards. Work with road associations or the county public works to address road issues that might cause problems during an evacuation. ☐ Training - find and organize training for the council including such items as CERT, HAM radio, home hardening and home ignition, etc. Could include partnership with other Fire Safe/Wise

■ Membership - Manage outreach to residents in our supported area, and engagement and management of members

organizations to sponsor and present.
